

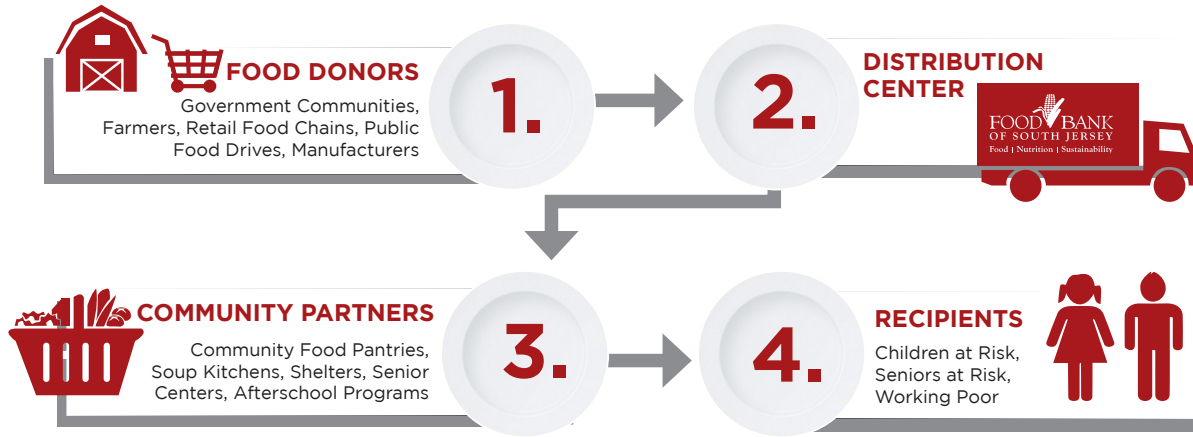

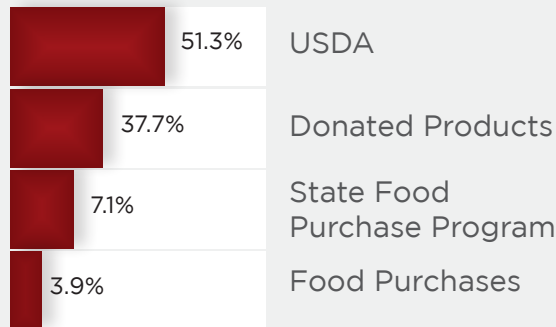
The Food Bank of South Jersey exists to provide food to needy people, teach them to eat nutritiously and find sustainable ways to improve their lives.

FOOD FLOW:



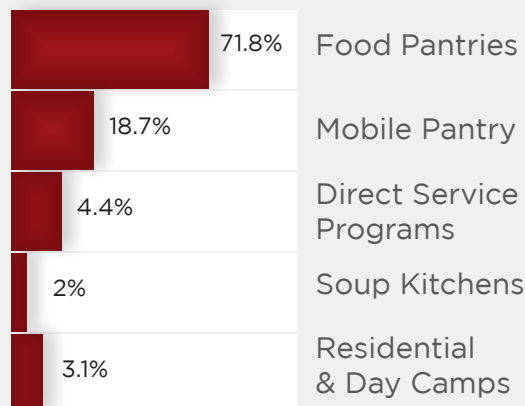
WHERE DOES THE FOOD COME FROM?

9.5 million pounds of food including more than 828,000 pounds of fresh produce were distributed by the Food Bank of South Jersey.



WHERE DOES THE FOOD GO?

We distribute food through 250 partners agencies and 60 direct service programs that target at-risk, vulnerable populations.



FACTS:

- Nonprofit 501(c)3 organization that has been feeding hungry people in South Jersey since 1985
- Largest source of non-government and government food assistance in South Jersey collecting nearly 10 million pounds of perishable and nonperishable food annually.
- Distributes food through 250 partner agencies in Burlington, Camden, Gloucester and Salem counties.
- Distributes an average 850,000 pounds of food each month
- Provides more than 828,000 pounds of fresh produce annually to agencies in South Jersey.
- All food and monetary donations raised in South Jersey stay in South Jersey.
- Partners with United Way agencies in South Jersey.
- Certified member of Feeding America.

WHERE DO THE FUNDS COME FROM?
